Other Higher Education Issues

Tuition and Fees

- SB 18 (Seliger) adopted by Senate Higher Education Committee on February 22 would eliminate the designated tuition set-aside requirement.
- SB 19 (Seliger) adopted by Senate Higher Education Committee on March 27.
 - The Committee-adopted version would freeze university tuition and fee rates for the next two years at 2016-17 levels.
 - In subsequent years, institutions would only be allowed to raise tuition above inflation if they meet targets on certain performance measures.

Other Higher Education Issues

Coordinating Board Loan Program

 SB 1380 (Seliger) and HB 2705 (Lozano) would authorize state higher education authorities to make alternative education loans using General Obligation bonds. They would no longer be required to restrict their territories to within the boundaries of the city or cities that created them.
