## Office of Enrollment Services

Recruitment Strategies

## First Time in College

- Surveyed feeder high schools to obtain needs from counselors and college advisers
- Assigned recruiters to high schools and admission staff to individual applicants
- Set admission targets by high school for completed applications
- Provided ACT and TSI exams free of charge for prospective and admitted students
- New software to monitor and track recruitment and admission goals

## Admissions Standards for First Time In College Students

- Minimum 2.5 GPA
- 17 ACT
- 900 SAT (820 on SAT exams prior to March 2016)
- Recommended/Distinguished/Foundation high school plan (Texas residents attending public high schools)

Recruitment Strategies

## **Transfer**

- Developed MOU's and academic pathways with area community colleges
- Assigned staff for admission and academic advising services for LSC, HCC and SJC
- Hosted "Transfer Days" at feeder community colleges to promote enrollment and student services
- Partnered with TSU academic advisers for dedicated enrollment and academic services

#### **Admissions Standards for Transfer Students**

- 2.0 Transfer GPA
- 15 or more college credits





2009=High School GPA ≥2.0 or above 2010=High School GPA ≥2.0 & ≥820 on SAT or ≥ 17 ACT





## Executive Summary of the Changes in the Admissions Standards

- The University changed admission standards to improve the quality of the first year students for the Fall 2012. For the previous year, enrollment was 9730. When the enrollment standards increased in 2012, enrollment fell by 176 students (-1.8%) and the following fall fell by 851 students or (-8.9%).
- The change resulted in only .1 of a point in the Freshmen's Class' High School GPA
- The change resulted in less than a point in the Freshmen's Class' High School ACT Score
- The change resulted in a drop of a point in the Freshmen's Class' High School SAT Score
- The change had no effect in their GPA at the end of their first semester.
- The loss of 851 students cost TSU almost \$3 million dollars.







# PURPOSE OF SOS

- Reduce or eliminate the number of developmental courses required in the fall semester.
- Develop academic skills for success in first year and subsequent college level courses.
- Expose students to University-Life and University & Community resources.

# SOS At-a-Glance

The Summer of Success Program is a rigorous five-week academic initiative designed to assist new students in preparing for success in college-level, degree-credit courses.

SOS students also receive supplemental academic support (e.g. individual and group tutoring from faculty and peer tutors).

#### **DETAILS:**

- July 7, 2018 through August 10, 2018
- \$900 (includes tuition, housing, meal plan, and books & supplies)
- Attendance is mandatory for class, study hall, evening and weekend activities.
- Courses being taught include Developmental Math and English, Music,
   Communications, Computer Science, and FS 102.
- Enrollment and Completion Advisors and staff members teach the FS 102 course.

• The Tutorial Centers will be open for students in SOS. Tutors will be available in the Fairchild Building, Learning Center, and residential facilities.

## **Academic Support Teams**

• The advisors will connect with instructors, SIs, and tutors weekly to discuss the academic progress of each student and implement needed academic interventions.



# **Enrollment Completion Advisor**


ECA's are tasked with advisement and enrollment of FTIC students. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Student will receive a letter grade
- 1 Credit Hour
- Sixteen ECA Advisors have a cohort average of 161

# Freshman Seminar syllabus

- The schedule focuses on TSU History, Academic support and Persistence, Personal Development, and Professional Development
- The syllabus incorporates traditional class-time, campus resource classes, and will be assessed through assignments measuring the classroom objectives.
- Student grades are made up by:
  - 60%: In-Class Participation & In-Class Assignments
  - 20%: Mandatory One-on-One Advising and Study Time
  - 10%: A Two Part Assignment on Their Four Year Explore Plan & Path to Success Analysis Paper
  - 10%: Path to Career Success Paper








