About the THECB Financial Aid Report

The Texas Legislature, Coordinating Board and people of Texas have been concerned for many years about the ability of Texas students to pay for college.

The Texas Charter for Higher Education (1987) called for public higher education to be accessible to all those who seek and qualify for admission. "Neither financial nor social status should serve as a barrier to opportunities for higher education in Texas. Financial aid as well as academic and social support services should be available. Texas colleges and universities shall actively recruit and retain students from populations that have not heretofore fully participated in higher education."¹

Closing the Gaps by 2015 (2000) states, "Economically disadvantaged students represent an increasing proportion of the state's traditional college-age population and should be considered a high priority for grant aid.² An unknown number of students never consider higher education because they believe they cannot afford it. Colleges and universities can attract students who historically have not believed that higher education is within their reach by making certain that higher education is affordable through financial aid."³

Since 1993, the Legislature has included in the General Appropriations Act a provision that calls for the Coordinating Board to prepare and submit to the Legislative Budget Board an annual report on financial aid in Texas. As we embark on the Coordinating Board's new strategic plan, 60x30TX, this report will be re-crafted to not only meet the requirements of the General Appropriations Act, but to also inform and support the attainment, completion, marketable skills, and student debt goals of 60x30TX.

This report provides an update on the financial aid received by students attending nonprofit institutions in Texas for the 2013-2014 academic year (state fiscal year 2014) and an analysis of students who applied for need-based student aid programs.^{4, 5} It is important to note that the data presented here may differ slightly from statistics found in other reports.⁶

For this report, 145 Texas public and independent colleges and universities (all institutions participating in state financial aid programs) contributed financial aid data for Fiscal Year 2014.

All data in the report are from the 2014 Financial Aid Database unless otherwise noted.

Summary: Fiscal Year 2014

- ✓ Students enrolled in Texas institutions of higher education in 2013-2014 and who applied for need-based assistance received a total of \$9.43 billion⁷ in the form of grant aid (awards such as grants and scholarships that are free to students and do not have to be repaid), work-study awards (part-time jobs provided to needy students through the financial aid office), and loans (funds that must be paid back, usually with interest, over time).
- ✓ 878,836 students in Texas who applied for need-based financial aid received some type of aid. This represents 60.5 percent of all students enrolled in fall 2013 at public and independent nonprofit colleges and universities and 87.9 percent of the students who enrolled *and* applied for need-based aid.
- √ The TEXAS Grant program provided \$345.43 million to over 87,000 students enrolled in Texas public colleges and universities. Approximately 75.5 percent of the recipients were from families with annual incomes less than \$40,000.
- ✓ Approximately 553,771 students (63.0 percent of all need-based aid recipients) received Federal Pell Grants totaling \$2.00 billion.
- ✓ The Federal Government provided 71.1 percent of the aid received.




Figure 1: Types of Aid to Students in Texas, FY 2014

As shown in Figure 1, *Loans* accounted for a majority of student aid distributed in Texas in FY 2014. Of the \$4.90 billion in student loans, 94.1 percent was distributed through federal loan programs.

Additional funds of \$823.73 million were received by 128,515 students who did not apply for need-based aid. See page 8. This aid is not included in the statistics quoted in this section of the report.




Figure 2: Sources of Aid to Students in Texas, FY 2014

As illustrated in Figure 2 above, approximately 7 out of every 10 dollars in aid for Texas students comes from the Federal Government in the form of loans, grant aid, and work-study. The \$6,700.57 million (\$6.70 billion) in federal aid represents an increase of \$17.51 million over FY 2013 levels. Meanwhile, state aid accounts for about 6.6 percent of total student aid and represents an increase of \$43.59 million (of which \$52.88 million represents an increase in the TEXAS Grant program compared to FY 2013 levels.).8

Grants accounted for 86.1 percent of the <u>total</u> growth in aid (federal, state, and private) between FY 2013 and FY 2014. Growth in grant aid was \$164.07 million. Loans comprised 13.9 percent of the total growth in aid – an increase of \$26.47 over the previous year. The work-study aid category is the only group that showed a reduction as compared to last year – \$2.3 million.

Financial aid provided by the institutions accounted for 13.5 percent of the total aid, or \$1,268.62 million (\$1.3 billion), an increase of \$68.88 million from the previous year. This amount includes \$259.72 million in foregone tuition and fee revenues through exemptions and waivers, \$151.48 million for the Texas Public Educational Grant program, \$1.51 million in student deposit scholarships, \$173.41 million in grant, loan, and work-study funds generated through set-asides from designated tuition, and \$3.36 million in institutional work-study. Merit aid provided by institutions equaled \$679.14 million.

"Other aid" includes Categorical Aid, Merit Aid to Institutions, Alternative Loans, and Other.

- Categorical aid includes funds from organizations outside the institution, such as Parent Teacher Organizations and the Veteran's Administration, that are not part of the aid package awarded by the institution's financial aid office and may not include a financial need requirement. In Texas, this type of aid accounted for 2.4 percent (\$223.77 million) of all aid awarded to support the education of students with financial need.
- Alternative non-federal loans, which account for 1.6 percent (\$148.60 million) of all aid awarded, are obtained by students to help fill the gap between a student's grant aid and other resources, and the amount needed to cover the total cost of attendance.
- Merit aid to institutions for students from private donors amounted to \$132.20 million or 1.4 percent of the total aid awarded.
- A group of other programs (scholarships, state programs too small to warrant separate columns in the database, fellowships, etc.) totaled \$332.12 million, which is approximately 3.5 percent of all aid awarded.

Financial Aid to Students - FY 2014




Figure 3: Financial Aid to All Recipients by Income (Grants vs. Loans), FY 2014

Figure 3 shows the distribution of need-based financial aid recipients in Texas by family income. Two trends are indicated:

- Low-income students are most likely to receive grant aid. Of the students receiving aid, 91.4 percent in the \$0–\$9,999 income range received grants and scholarships; 53.9 percent received loans.
- Students in the \$60,000+ income bracket often have high Expected Family Contribution (EFC) ¹⁰ levels based on the Federal Methodology for determining a family's ability to pay for college. If the expected family assistance is not available or forthcoming, students may need or choose to borrow funds to cover the costs of an education. Of the students receiving aid, only 55.0 percent in the \$60,000+ income range received grant aid; 74.6 percent received loans. Figure 3 represents the inverse relationship between income and the receipt of grants as well as the positive correlation between income and borrowing.




Figure 4: Percent of Aid Funds by Type for Basic Needy Students, FY 2014

Texas aid recipients on both ends of the income spectrum rely heavily on student loans to finance their education. Even students with the most limited family resources for financing higher education rely, in part, on borrowing. Figures 4 and 5 on the following two pages show the reliance on loans for two groups of students with financial need: "Basic Needy Students" and "Needy Students Using Aid, in Part, to Replace Family Contribution."

¹⁰ The calculation of Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is sensitive to the size of the family and the number of children in college at the same time. Typically, a three-member family with an income of \$60,000 would show a higher EFC than an eight-member family with the same income. The difference would be even greater if the second family had more than one person in college at the same time. Appendix B provides an overview of the process used to assess student financial need.

Sources of Aid Distributed by Student Category – FY 2014

Data from the Financial Aid Database is used to divide students¹¹ into four general categories: "Basic Needy Students," "Needy Students Using Aid, in Part, to Replace Family Contribution," "Students Who Received No Aid", and "Students Who Applied for and Received only Merit or Performance-Based Aid."

1) **Basic Needy Students** are students who received at least one type of aid that was awarded, in part, on the basis of an assessment of their resources for paying for college and whose resources, including contributions from family and financial aid, were equal to or less than the cost of attendance. In this category, 80.7 percent of the students had family incomes of less than \$40,000. The median income was in the \$20,000–\$25,000 bracket and the average Expected Family Contribution was \$1,957.60.

A total of 708,991 students, or 80.7 percent of all students receiving need-based financial aid in Texas, were in this category. Figure 4 shows the distribution of aid by type for students in this category.

¹¹ Prior to FY 2010, students must have completed the equivalent of a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA) and be admitted to the institution, to be included in the Financial Aid Database. In FY 2010, the report was expanded to include data on students who did not apply for need-based aid, but received merit or performance-based assistance.

2) **Needy Students Using Aid, in Part, to Replace Family Contribution**. A second group includes 169,845 students representing 19.3 percent of all recipients of aid awarded on the basis of financial need. This group differs from the previous one because the awards students received, when added to their Expected Family Contributions, exceeded their costs of attendance. For most students, this occurred when they took out loans to replace all or a part of their Expected Family Contribution. Others received some need-based assistance, but also merit-based aid that caused their total resources to exceed cost.

Most of the students in this second group come from families with moderate incomes. As a result, the federal need analysis (Federal Methodology) expects their families, on average, to provide \$17,490 more per year from their own resources than it expects from families in the "Basic Needy Students" group. Many of the families rely on certain types of aid (primarily unsubsidized student loans) to finance education because they are unable to provide this amount from personal sources.

In this category, only 21.2 percent of the students were from families with incomes less than \$40,000 per year. The median income was greater than \$85,000, and the average Expected Family Contribution was \$19,495. Figure 5 shows the distribution of aid by type for these students.

Figure 5: Percent of Aid Funds by Type for Needy Students Using Aid, in Part, to Replace Family Contribution, FY 2014



3) **Students Who Received No Aid.** The third group of students included in the Financial Aid Database is students enrolled in college who applied for, but did not receive any need-based aid. The number of students in this group equaled 120,894.

In this category 48.7 percent of the students were from families with incomes less than \$40,000 per year. The median income was in the \$40,000-\$45,000 bracket, and the average Expected Family Contribution was \$9,472.46.

Why would students who apply for aid fail to receive any? Members of the Coordinating Board's Financial Aid Advisory Committee helped provide the following explanations:

- Students completed the federal application for aid, but did not provide all required documents.
- Students were eligible for aid and applied on time; however, there was not enough grant aid available, and the students chose not to accept loans and/or work-study.
- Students were awarded aid, but the aid required a certain minimum level of enrollment (usually at least half-time); and students dropped classes and lost eligibility.
- Students were late in applying for aid. When the aid offices received their applications, the schools no longer had grant aid funds available and the student declined the schools' offers of loans and/or work-study.¹²
- Some families' resources exceeded the cost of attendance (according to federal need analysis calculations), disqualifying the students for most aid, and the families chose to acquire assistance through private sources.
- Continuing students could not qualify for aid because they failed to meet academic progress requirements, were in default on student loans, or for other reasons were ineligible.
- Continuing or transfer students could no longer receive aid (or a specific type of aid, such as loans) because they had reached the programs' aggregate limits.
- Students were not enrolled in certificate or degree plans a requirement for most financial aid.
- Students did not take enough hours to qualify for financial aid.



¹² Senate Bill 851, passed by the 82nd Legislature, Regular Session, called for the Coordinating Board, working with institutions, to establish a uniform priority application deadline for state financial aid. The deadline, which only applies to general academic teaching institution students, was set as March 15 and went into effect in spring, 2013.

4) **Students Who Applied for and Received only Merit or Performance-Based Aid.** The fourth group of students included in the Financial Aid Database is students who applied for and received only merit- or performance-based aid. Unlike the students in the first three groups included in the Database, they did not apply for need-based aid. The number of students in this group was 128,515.

The aid reported for these students includes scholarships, exemptions, waivers, or categorical aid. The graphic below reflects the distribution of the aid received by institution type.



Financial Aid by Students' Home Regions – FY 2014

Of the \$9.43 billion awarded to need-based aid applicants attending institutions of higher education in Texas, \$8.36 billion was awarded to 782,976 students classified as Texas residents. These students represented 89.1 percent of all aid recipients who completed a needs analysis. The balance of funds went to approximately 95,860 aid recipients from other states and countries who are attending college in Texas.

Figure 7 below shows the amounts and the number of students from each region in Texas receiving some form of student financial aid awarded on the basis of an assessment of the family's need for assistance.

Due to state fiscal constraints, operations for the following programs, which provided 11,800 awards totaling \$19.8 million in FY 2011, were discontinued for the 2012-2013 biennium. Legislation authorizing the programs has not been repealed, but the programs received no funds for the 2013-2014 biennium.

- Educational Aide Exemption Program¹⁶
- Temporary Assistance to Needy Family Exemption Program¹⁶
- Early High School Graduation Scholarship
- Professional and Vocational Nursing Scholarship Programs
- Engineering Scholarship Program

Funding for the TEXAS Grant program increased \$52.88 million from FY 2013 to FY 2014. Funding for the Tuition Equalization Grant Program increased \$5.22 million, and funding for the Texas Educational Opportunity Grant Program increased by \$2.15 million in FY 2014.

Major Grant Program Recipients by Income and Ethnicity, FY 2010 – 2014¹⁷

Figures 8, 9, and 10 on the following page illustrate income distributions for students receiving assistance through the state's three main grant programs – the Toward EXcellence, Access and Success (TEXAS) Grant, Tuition Equalization Grant (TEG) and Texas Educational Opportunity Grant (TEOG) programs – for the past five years. The figures reflect numbers of recipients in each income bracket. Fluctuations in the numbers of awards are primarily the result of changes in program funding levels. Table 6, below, provides the funding levels and total number of awards per year for each program.

As shown by the figures on pages 12 and 13, the three programs serve different populations. All three programs require recipients to show financial need and awards cannot exceed a student's need. However, financial need is a function of both cost and family resources. A student from the same family, attending a community college, a public university, or an independent institution will have three levels of need, as family resources are compared to three levels of cost.

- The TEXAS Grant program, by statute, targets its funds to the needlest students. Increased appropriations beginning in FY 2009 have allowed the program to continue to serve students from the lowest income groups and also extend its awards to some middle-income students. Funding cuts in FY 2012 did not reverse the trend because "target" average award amounts were recommended to the schools in lieu of maximum award amounts allowed by statute. As a result, amounts per student were decreased and the number of students served continued to increase.
- TEG is limited to students attending independent institutions institutions that typically have the highest average costs. Therefore, TEG recipients are spread across the income brackets with a larger share coming from middle-income families than for TEXAS Grant or TEOG.
- TEOG is limited to students attending public two-year institutions institutions that have the lowest average costs. The vast majority of TEOG recipients are in the lower income brackets, but a significant increase in funding for FY 2010, continued in FY 2011, allowed institutions to make some awards to middle income students.

Figure 8: TEXAS Grant Awards by Income Level of Recipients, FY 2010 - 201418




Figure 9: TEG Awards by Income Level of Recipients, FY 2010 - 2014¹⁸





Figure 10: TEOG Awards by Income Level of Recipients, FY 2010 - 2014¹⁸

Figures 11, 12, and 13 compare TEXAS Grant, TEG and TEOG recipients by ethnicity with regard to enrollment percentages, shares of grant recipients and shares of funds. In all three programs, African-American and Hispanic students received higher percentages of funds and awards than were represented by their respective shares of enrollment. These programs are being used to encourage Hispanic and African-American students to attend and graduate from college – one of the state's primary goals, as expressed in *Closing the Gaps by 2015*.

Figure 11: FY 2014 Enrollments, TEXAS Grant Funds Received, and Award Recipients¹⁹




Figure 12: FY 2014 Enrollments, TEG Funds Received, and Award Recipients¹⁹





Figure 13: FY 2014 Enrollments, TEOG Funds Received, and Award Recipients¹⁹

TEXAS Grant and Closing the Gaps

For the state's future economic well-being, Texas must enroll more students in higher education and help them acquire critical knowledge and skills. With an undereducated workforce, Texas will be unable to attract, retain, and grow businesses and industries that offer high paying jobs.

A 2007 study by the Perryman Group, *A Tale of Two States—And One Million Jobs!*, ²⁰ describes the economic and social benefits to the state if the goals outlined in *Closing the Gaps by 2015* are achieved. The study concludes that Texas will prosper if those goals are reached. It emphatically states that remarkable gains can be made by investing in higher education and achieving the goals of *Closing the Gaps*.

Financial aid will play a vital role in allowing access to higher education for hundreds of thousands of Texas students over the next decade. Demographic trends show that most of these new students will come from families with few financial resources and no history of participation in higher education.²¹ To attract these students to higher education, financial aid will have to be available.




Figure 14: TEXAS Grant Expenditures at Public Institutions, FY 2010 – 2014²² (Current Dollars)

The Towards Excellence, Access and Success (TEXAS) Grant program plays an essential part in this effort. It is the state's largest financial aid program. Figure 14 shows that amounts awarded through the program for FY 2012 and FY 2013 decreased, but have returned to FY 2011 levels in FY 2014. Figure 8 on page 12 shows that the number of recipients continued to increase even in FY 2013, but this was accomplished through the use of smaller awards per student. If funded at a level that enabled all eligible students to receive awards equal to their tuition and fee costs, the TEXAS Grant program could provide reliable assistance to students with unmet financial need and help the state achieve the goals set out in *Closing the Gaps*.


Institutional View of Student Aid in Texas – FY 2014

Figure 15 illustrates the distribution of loans, work-study, and grant aid received by need-based aid recipients attending Texas public and private nonprofit institutions submitting data for this report. Although it is a type of grant aid, TEXAS Grant is shown separately because of high interest in this program.

The reliance on grant aid and loans at public and private universities is similar, in spite of the fact that on average, private universities' annual costs exceed those of their public counterparts by \$14,489.²³ Students at two-year institutions rely less on loans than do their university counterparts.

As the cost of attendance rises for public and private universities and health-related institutions, loans continue to account for the majority of financial aid received.

Figure 15: Percent of Financial Aid Awarded by Aid Type and Type of Institution - FY 2014



Figure 16 shows that need-based aid recipients attending public and private universities receive more loan than grant aid (loans represent 57.3 and 48.6 percent of all aid, respectively) while aid recipients attending public two-year institutions (community colleges, technical colleges, and state colleges) receive more grants than loans. At public community colleges loans represent only 34.6 percent of the aid received.

Based on FY 2014 data, need-based aid applicants attending public or private health-related institutions receive, on average, \$25,100 - \$28,600 in aid per year. 84.9 percent of the public health-related institution funds and 87.7 percent of the private health-related institution funds are in the form of loans.

Average Unmet Need for Aid Recipients in Texas – FY 2014




Figure 17: Average Unmet Financial Need per Recipient by Type of Institution, FY 2014

Figure 17 compares the average cost of attendance at each type of institution in Texas to the average resources available to aid recipients. The line represents costs and includes tuition and fees, books, supplies and living expenses. The bars include family contribution, grant aid, work-study, and loans – all resources available to the students. The gap between the red line (cost) and the top of each bar is the average unmet need that aid recipients in that sector face.

Costs exceed resources²⁴ on average by \$10,373 for students attending public universities and by \$6,801 for students attending public two-year institutions. Off-campus employment and cost-savings actions such as roommates, public transportation, and on-line courses enable students to find a way to make ends meet.

Financial Aid Growth in Texas: Grant vs. Loan Programs - FY 2010 - 2014




Figure 18: Financial Aid²⁵ in Texas, FY 2010 – 2014 (Constant 2014 Dollars in Millions)

Figure 18 shows that the total amount of aid received by need-based aid applicants in Texas in FY 2014 (\$9.43 billion) was larger (5.8 percent) than in FY 2010 (\$8.92 billion). Both grant and loan volumes have remained steady overall. It shows that loan volumes have annually exceeded grant aid volumes. Loans have traditionally represented 52-54 percent of the aid received by Texas students, whereas grant aid has represented 46-48 percent. In FY 2014, loans provided 51.9 percent of all aid; grant aid 47.4 percent, and work-study provided 0.7 percent.

As already noted, during the first three years of this 5-year period, the state experienced significant growth in federal, state, and institutional grant aid programs, including the initiation of two federal grant programs (the National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent (SMART) Grants and Academic Competitive Grants (CACG). These increases enabled student reliance on grant aid to almost reach parity with their reliance on loans. As already noted, state funding for financial aid decreased between FY 2011 and FY 2013. There were significant losses in federal aid, also. The following federal programs, which provided \$70.12 million in FY2013, also ceased to exist as of FY 2013:

- SMART Grant program
- Academic Competitiveness Grant
- Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership Grant program
- Special Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership Grant program
- Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship program



Aid in Texas compared with the United States²⁶ - FY 2010 – 2014

During the past five years, the reliance on loans of students attending nonprofit institutions in Texas increased until FY 2012 when it began a slight decline to FY 2014. In 2010, state percentages of loans and grants were almost equal, but that gap has widened since that time. For students in Texas, federal, state and institutional work-study programs provide about 0.7 percent of the aid per year. Of the remaining funds in FY 2014, on average, 47.4 percent were in the form of grant aid and 51.9 percent were loans. This split is shown by the columns in Figure 19.

Two trends can be seen from Figure 19. First, the nationwide percentages of grant aid and loans are steadily diverging. Second, in FY 2014, Texas students relied more heavily on loans than they did in 2010, and more so than did their national counterparts.



National Trends in Student Aid, FY 2010 – 2014

The national trend of student aid shows growth, but not in all programs. Overall funding for aid between 2010 and 2014 increased by 1.3 percent in constant 2014 dollars.

Nationally, institutions supply 21.8 percent of all grant aid, including awards funded through tuition setasides, exemptions and waivers, and merit aid awarded through the institutions from their own endowments. State grant programs nationwide have shown a relatively steady growth for the period between 2010 and 2014. In FY 2012 five federal grant programs were discontinued (see page 18) and the average award for Pell Grants declined, causing a decrease and then leveling of the overall trend for federal grants.




Figure 21: Loan Growth in the Nation, FY 2010 – 2014 ²⁹ (Constant 2014 Dollars in Millions)

Figure 21 shows that nationwide, subsidized and unsubsidized federal Stafford loans experienced dramatic changes in FY 2013. Beginning in FY 2013, graduate students were no longer eligible for subsidized loans. As a result, all of the graduate dollars were from unsubsidized loans. Nonfederal loans (including state and alternative loans) volumes rose slightly from FY 2011 to FY 2014.

Nationally, federal loans now constitute 36.5 percent of total aid to undergraduate and graduate students attending nonprofit institutions. A decrease from 39.2 percent in FY 2013.



Figure 22, based on data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics website (Last Modified Date: April 2, 2015), shows average weekly earnings and unemployment rates for persons who have attained different levels of education.³³

The \$9.43 billion in student financial aid awarded to need-based aid applicants in Texas in 2013-2014 may create the false illusion that there is adequate assistance for higher education. But most of this aid was acquired in the form of loans. For the lowest-income families, an increasing loan burden may appear daunting.

Decreasing the higher education financial burden of the most needy families through prudent investment in need-based aid such as the TEXAS Grant Program can help students afford college and will send a strong signal of our state's commitment to higher education for all Texans.

Appendix A: Data Restrictions and Variables

The limitations of the data used in this report are as follows:

- The Texas Financial Aid Database does not include information on students attending for-profit
 institutions in Texas. It only includes data for students attending nonprofit public or independent
 institutions in the state. National data for Pell Grants, Stafford Subsidized and Unsubsidized
 Loans, and PLUS loans were adjusted to reflect only funds going to students attending nonprofit
 institutions.¹ National data for other federal grants, institutional aid, and non-federal loans
 include data of for-profit institutions.
- 2. The data only include student loans *accepted* rather than funds offered. Some students decline some or all of the student loan funds offered to them and instead choose to work, reduce costs, or find alternative means of support.
- 3. The data only include work-study funds that were *earned* rather than funds offered. Some students work fewer hours than their work-study awards would have authorized; and, therefore, earn less than their original award amounts. Some (for instance, nursing students with laboratory courses) have heavy course loads and decline work-study awards, choosing to take additional loans instead.
- 4. Students who were offered *only* loans and declined to accept those loans are not reflected in the total number of students. Students who received need-based grant aid but declined loans are included in the total number of students since they received the grant aid.
- 5. National data is based on the federal academic year (July 1, 2013 to June 31, 2014). State data is based on each institution's academic year.
- 6. Neither state nor national data capture information on:
 - a. Student wages that are not a result of formal work-study programs,
 - b. Consumer loans used to finance education (only educational loans are included),
 - c. Credit card debt used to finance education.

Appendix B: Federal Need Analysis¹

Description

In order to receive any aid from the Federal Pell Grant, FWS, FSEOG, and Federal Perkins Loans programs as well as subsidized loans under the Direct Loan (and FFEL before it ended) programs, students must first establish their financial eligibility. The entire application process is often referred to as need analysis because program administrators are trying to determine each applicant's financial need for federal student aid.

The application form used for this purpose is called the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA collects demographic, income, and asset information from aid applicants and their families. This information is used to estimate the amount, called the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) that students and their families can reasonably be expected to pay for postsecondary expenses for a given award year.

The EFC is determined by a need analysis formula established in Title IV of the Higher Education Act; the formula is called the Federal Methodology (FM). The first step under FM is to determine the student's dependency status. This step identifies the scope of information required to be provided on the FAFSA. If students are considered independent, their parents are not expected to pay any portion of their postsecondary expenses and no parental information is required on the FAFSA. Students are automatically considered independent if they are 24 years old or older; are married; have legal dependents; are orphans; are or were wards of the court, emancipated minors, in foster care, or in legal guardianship; meet certain conditions related to homelessness or unaccompanied minor status; are currently serving on active duty in, or are veterans of, the Armed Forces; or if they are in graduate or professional school. All other students are considered dependent, unless the financial aid administrator determines other unusual and extenuating circumstances exist that justify independent status. Parents are expected to provide financial information on the FAFSA and to contribute some amount—as calculated by the FM—to the financing of their dependent child's education.

Regardless of whose information is included, not all of the family's income and assets are considered, as FM includes several income and asset protection allowances. These allowances protect a certain portion of an applicant's income and assets from the need analysis calculations. For example, all applicants exclude the home equity of their primary residence from the FAFSA. Families who live on farms that they operate also exclude the net worth of the farm. Small business owners exclude the net worth of those businesses. The FM also excludes other types of financial assets, such as retirement savings and a portion of education savings. Similarly, various allowances for taxes and certain non-education-related living costs protect portions of the family income.

In addition, the need analysis formula takes into consideration the number of financially dependent children enrolled at least half time in postsecondary education during the academic year, and other financial and non-financial circumstances.

Finally, there are two statute-based variations in the FM. For the 2013-2014 award year, families with AGIs of \$24,000 or less and who meet certain tax-filing or other requirements are automatically assigned a zero EFC. Families with less than \$50,000 in adjusted gross income who meet certain tax-filing or other requirements may qualify for the simplified needs test, which excludes all assets from consideration.

The purpose of the FM is to ensure that each applicant's eligibility is evaluated in a uniform way as compared with applicants in similar situations. To address students with unusual circumstances, federal

law authorizes financial aid administrators to make adjustments—if such a change is warranted—to applicants' cost of attendance (COA), dependency status, or FM data elements for students in unique circumstances. These adjustments to the standard FM are commonly called professional judgment decisions.

A family's EFC is determined after all of these adjustments to income and assets are made. The EFC is based on a proportion of the income and assets deemed available for postsecondary expenses. The exact proportion available depends on the student's dependency status, family size, number in college, and other factors.

Use

Financial aid administrators use the EFC and other information to determine which students will receive federal student aid authorized under Title IV of the HEA and the amounts they will receive from these programs. Students are eligible to receive need-based federal student aid only if the EFC is less than the total COA. The COA includes tuition and fees charges, the estimated living expenses (or room and board charges for students who plan to live in on-campus housing), books and educational supplies, transportation to and from the postsecondary institution, and other miscellaneous expenses.

Financial aid administrators also use this system to assess student need for state aid.

Appendix E: Excerpt from Federal Financial Aid Glossary

(Website http://ifap.ed.gov/ifap/helpGlossary.jsp was referenced for most of the definitions below). Footnotes shown below are not a part of the original Glossary. They have been added to relate the federal definitions to state programs.

Adjusted Gross Income (AGI)

An individual's adjusted gross income as reported to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The rules for calculating AGI are set by the IRS, not the Department.

Aid Package

A school's process for determining the type and amount assistance (from all sources) that will be offered to a student to include a combination of scholarships, grants, loans, and/or work-study assembled by the financial aid office of a college or university for an eligible recipient.

Allocation

A specific sum of money awarded to an institution for use during a specific period. Campus-Based funds (Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant [FSEOG], Federal Work-Study [FWS], and Federal Perkins Loan) are allocated to a school on an award-year basis. An allocation may also be referred to as obligation, award authorization, grant authorization, or Document Number.

Appropriation²

At the federal level, a congressional legislative act allocating a specific amount of public funds to be spent for a specific purpose during a fiscal year or award year. The dollar amount appropriated may be equal to or less than (but not more than) the total amount permissible under the authorizing statute.

Award

As a noun, a specific amount of financial assistance to pay for education costs offered to a student through one or more financial aid programs. As a verb, approving financial assistance to students. A participating school makes a determination of the amounts and types of assistance it has available to offer to the student along with any other types of assistance the student may have received or will receive. Under 34 CFR 668.16(h), the school is required to provide information about the source and amount of each type of aid offered.

Award Letter

An official document issued by a financial aid office listing the types and amounts of all the financial aid awarded to the student. Generally, the award letter includes information about the cost of attendance and terms and conditions for the financial aid.

Budget

The total cost of attending a post-secondary school for one academic year. The student's budget usually includes tuition, fees, room, board, books, supplies, travel, and personal expenses. Each school develops its own student budget.

Campus-Based Programs

Federally funded financial aid programs that are administered by eligible participating schools. Campus-Based Programs include Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOG), and Federal Work-Study (FWS). Also see Fiscal Operations Report and Application to Participate (FISAP).

Cosigner

A person who signs the promissory note in addition to the borrower and is responsible for the obligation if the borrower does not pay.

Cost of Attendance (COA)

Costs related to a student's enrollment in a postsecondary school for a defined academic period. COA components include tuition and fees, room and board, allowances for books and supplies, transportation, and miscellaneous personal expenses, along with other applicable expenses such as loan fees, dependent-care costs, costs related to a disability, and study-abroad costs, as outlined in Section 472 of the HEA. The EFC is subtracted from the COA to determine the student's need for aid.

Direct Loan (DL)

A federal program, also called the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program, through which the U.S. Government rather than a commercial lender provides four types of education loans to student and parent borrowers: Subsidized and Unsubsidized Stafford Loans for students, PLUS Loans for parents, and Consolidation Loans for all borrowers.

Eligible Applicant/Student

An eligible applicant is a student who has submitted a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and who meets the eligibility requirements of the FSA programs.³ The student must be currently enrolled or be a prospective student at a postsecondary school eligible to participate in the FSA programs.

Eligible Borrower⁴

A borrower or potential borrower who meets federal eligibility criteria for a Federal Stafford loan or, in the case of a parent borrower, a Federal PLUS loan.

Estimated Financial Assistance (EFA)

The school's estimate of the amount of financial assistance that a student has been or will be awarded for the enrollment period for which a loan is sought. The EFA includes assistance from federal, state, institutional, scholarship, grant, financial need-based employment, or other sources.

Expected Family Contribution (EFC)

A calculated amount, based on a formula established by Congress, of how much the student's family can be expected to contribute toward the cost of the student's education in an award year. The EFC is calculated when the CPS successfully processes a student's FAFSA information and is one component schools use to determine the amount and type of aid the student can receive.

Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records.

Federal Perkins Loan Program

A Campus-Based loan program provides low-interest student loans to undergraduate and graduate students with financial need. See Campus-Based Programs.

Federal Work-Study (FWS) Program

A Campus-Based Title IV program that provides part-time employment to students attending institutions of higher education who need the earnings to help meet their costs of postsecondary education and encourages students receiving FWS assistance to participate in community service activities.

Financial Aid

The cost of attendance for a student, minus the expected family contribution for such student, and any estimated financial assistance not received under Title IV. Financial Aid is financial assistance in the form of scholarships, grants, work-study, and loans for education.

Financial Aid Package

The total amount of financial aid (federal and nonfederal) such as scholarships, grants, loans, and/or work-study awarded to a student.

Financial Need

An eligible student's Cost of attendance minus Expected Family Contribution (EFC) minus estimated financial assistance (EFA) not received under Title IV.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

A financial aid application form completed by students and parents which is used to determine an applicant's eligibility for the federal student aid programs. Information provided is the source for all FSA need analysis computations, including the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC).

Gift Aid

Financial assistance, such as grants and scholarships that do not need to be repaid.

Grant Programs

Gift-aid programs that require neither repayment nor a work obligation from students. Federal Title IV grant programs are the Federal Pell Grant Program, and the Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) Program.⁵

Loan

An advance of funds guaranteed by a signed promissory note in which the recipient of the funds promises to repay a specified amount under prescribed conditions. A financial source that is available to students and their parents through student loan programs with varying interest rates and repayment provisions to supplement the family's financial resources, scholarships, and grants.

Merit Based

A means of determining eligibility for certain types of financial aid using merit, such as a specific accomplishment or talent as the determining factor, rather than financial need.

National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (NASFAA)

Professional association representing the student financial aid interests of institutions of postsecondary education in the U.S.

Need

The difference between the Cost of Attendance (COA) and the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is the student's financial need. It is the gap between the cost of attending the school and the student's resources.

Need Analysis

The process of determining the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) based on the formula established by Congress. Also known as Federal Need Analysis Methodology and Federal Methodology.

Non-Subsidized Loan (Unsubsidized Loan)

A loan that is not eligible for federal interest benefits. The borrower is responsible for paying the interest on the outstanding principal balance of a non-subsidized loan throughout the life of the loan. During the in-school, grace, and deferment periods, these interest payments are normally made on a monthly or quarterly basis, or are capitalized.

Packaging

The process of determining the types and amounts of financial aid awards (loans, grants, scholarships, and employment) and offering those awards to a student.

Parent Loans for Undergraduate Students (PLUS)

PLUS loans enable parents to borrow federal funds to pay the education expenses of each child who is a dependent undergraduate student.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

The qualitative (grade point average) and quantitative (time limit) measure of a student's progress toward completing a program of study. To maintain eligibility for FSA program assistance, the student must show continued progress.⁶ Schools must establish policies regarding satisfactory academic progress and must check the progress of FSA recipients at least once each academic year.

Scholarships

A form of financial assistance that does not have to be repaid. Scholarships may be awarded based on any number of criteria, such as academics, achievements, hobbies, talents, and affiliations with various groups, or career aspirations.

Simplified Needs Test

A formula under the Federal Methodology (FM) that ignores the asset information reported on the FAFSA in calculating a student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC). It is also referred to as a simplified formula. Also see Federal Methodology.

Student Aid Report (SAR)

The output document that the CPS⁷ sends to a student after a FAFSA is processed. It summarizes the information the student submitted on the FAFSA; reports the student's calculated EFC; provides comments to the student as well as information for the financial aid administrator; and reports the student's NSLDS financial aid history. Also see Output Document and Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR).

Subsidized Loan

A FFEL or Direct Loan that is eligible for interest benefits paid by the federal government. The federal government pays the interest that accrues on subsidized loans during an in-school, grace, authorized deferment, and (if applicable) post-deferment grace periods if the borrower meets certain eligibility requirements.

Undergraduate Student

A degree-seeking student at a college or university who has not earned a first bachelor's degree.8

Unsubsidized Loan

An unsubsidized (unsub) loan is a loan given to a student not eligible for (or who has exhausted his/her eligibility for a subsidized loan) that will begin accruing interest charges from the disbursement date forward. Interest is charged on these loans from the date of disbursement. While the student is in school, in the grace period, or in deferment, students may elect to make pay the interest or have it capitalized and added to the principal.

Veteran

For FSA⁹ purposes, such as determining dependency status, a veteran is a former member of the U.S. Armed Forces who served on active duty (other than for training purposes) and was discharged other than dishonorably.

Federal Work-Study Program¹⁰

A Campus-Based program, awarded by the college, in which eligible students work part-time to help fund their education.





Appendix F: FY 2014 Cost of Attendance Budgets for Texas Public and Independent Nonprofit Colleges and Universities







Share of Each Ethnic Group Enrolled by Institution that Received a Tuition Equalization Grant







Background: Prior to 2003, the Texas Legislature had the regulatory authority to set tuition rates, generally mandating that the same statutory and designated tuition rate be charged across the state. In 2003 the 78th Legislature passed House Bill (HB) 3015, amending Texas Education Code (TEC) §54.0513 to allow governing boards of public universities to set different designated tuition rates. There is no upper limit on the amount of designated tuition that a university may charge and the amounts may vary by program, course level, and academic period. Tuition deregulation became effective September 1, 2003, and universities began increasing designated tuition in spring 2004. In addition to granting institutions the authority to set tuition rates, the legislation requires universities to set-aside a portion of tuition revenues generated from designated tuition charges in excess of \$46 per semester credit hour for financial aid targeted to financially needy students.



Institutional 3-year cohort default rates and loan forgiveness rates are announced to institutions and is on the Coordinating Board's web site (http://www.thecb.state.tx.us/reports/pdf/6058.pdf). In accordance with Senate Bill 215, 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, institutions whose BOT default rates exceed the statewide average and those whose BOT forgiveness rates are less than 50% of the statewide average will be notified that their BOT loan recipients must complete the loan repayment and default prevention counseling module established for this purpose.

Additionally, the Coordinating Board will notify participating independent institutions that the Board adopted rules drafted by the Negotiated Rulemaking Committee on B-On-Time for Independent Institutions, including a provision stating that allocated BOT funds must be encumbered by February 20 and all unencumbered funds will be reallocated to Public Institutions by March 15.

Here are details for three-year cohorts where (a) left-school-date is between 09/01/2011 and 08/31/2012 (called the Forgiveness Rate Cohort (FRC)) and (b) in repayment where the original contract date is between 09/01/2011 and 08/31/2012 (called Repayment Rate Cohort (RRC).

In the Forgiveness Rate Cohort (FRC), there were 3,014 students of which 1,170 were new to BOT. The FRC had 1,844 renewal students (those who received more than one loan). 907 (30.1%) had their BOT loan forgiven. That is, these students fulfilled the terms of the loan agreement of maintaining a B average (3.0 on a four-point scale) and completing their education on time.

There were 2,474 students in the RRC of which 1,177 had new loans and 1,297 had multiple loans indicating renewals. 671 (27%) of the students' loans fell into default. 32.0% of the students in the FRC and 38.9% of the students in the RRC are in repayment. These students did not meet a requirement of the BOT loan and are repaying the balance that they borrowed.




Merit Aid Provided by Institutions




