College of the Mainland (COM) has been experiencing a 7% increase in enrollment during the past academic year and data suggests that this increase-if not a greater increase-will continue. The high demand occupations in our area are nursing and process technology for the petrochemical industry. COM, as do all community colleges in the state, also offers affordable and accessible transfer degrees for students who cannot afford to spend four years at a university.

At the same time that enrollment is increasing, revenue from our local tax base and from the state has been decreasing. Property tax valuations have dropped 16% since Hurricane Ike devastated our county in 2008. The state has already required a 10% decrease in our state funding.

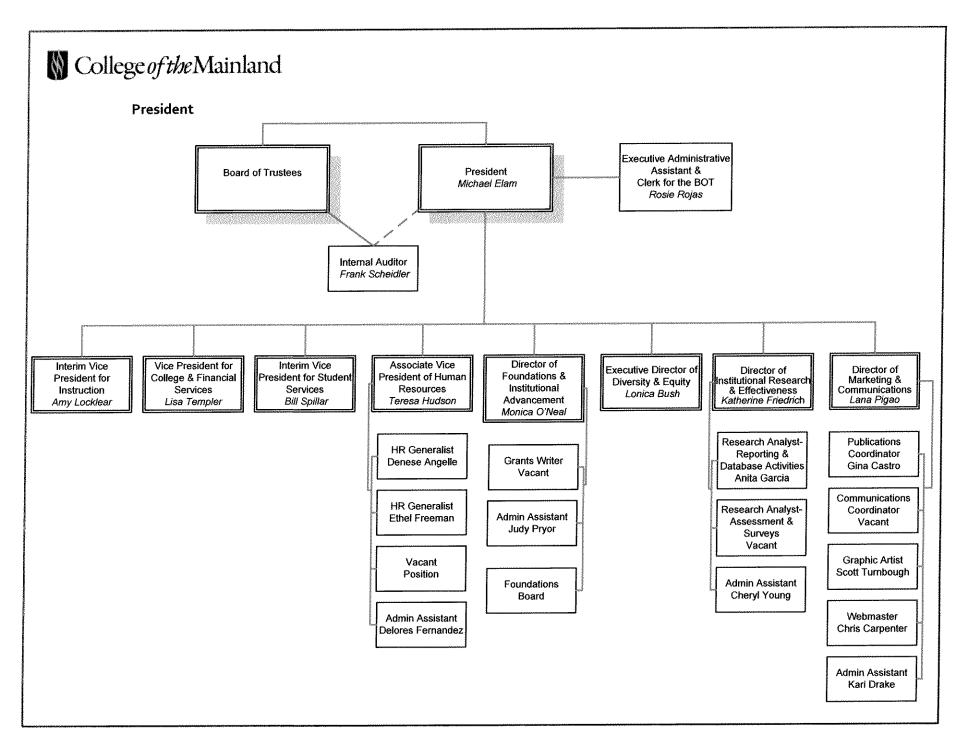
One of the reasons for enrollment growth is the economic downturn; however, the economic downturn negatively impacts all of our taxpayers. COM's tax base is greatly enhanced by the petrochemical industry. In turn, COM trains and educates the industry's incumbent and future workers. The industry, understandably, constantly seeks tax relief in the form of abatements and exemptions Should sought after exemptions by some of our larger taxpaying refineries be granted, COM will stand to lose a significant amount of tax revenue.

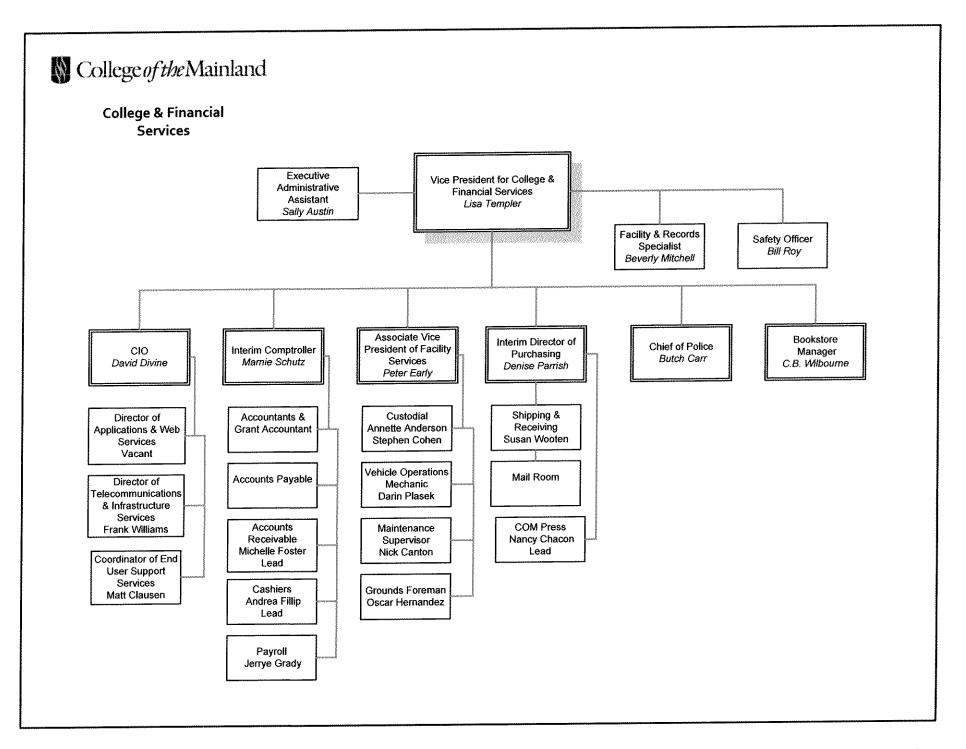
COM has a forty-two year old infrastructure that is in bad need of repair and placement. The College needs new buildings for more classroom and laboratory space to accommodate the enrollment increases and the projected future increases. These kinds of repairs and construction require the support of an ad valorem bond. Yet, if the College must significantly increase its tax rate to make up for the loss of state and local revenue, our taxpayers are not likely to support a bond

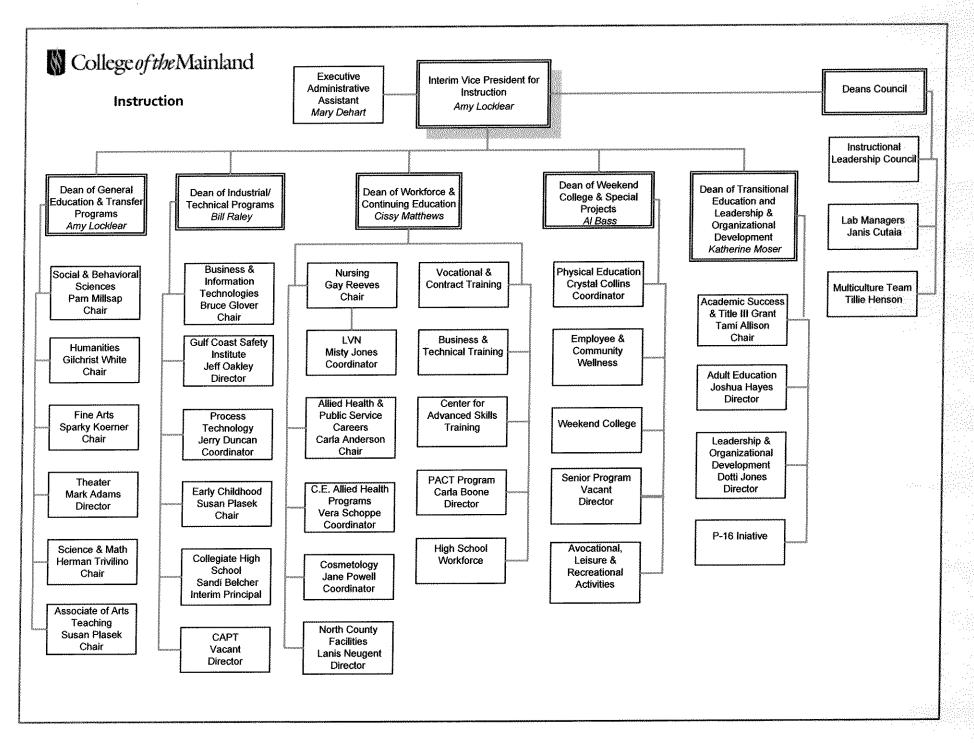
For the above reasons, College of the Mainland strongly endorses the formula request made by the Texas Association of Community Colleges.

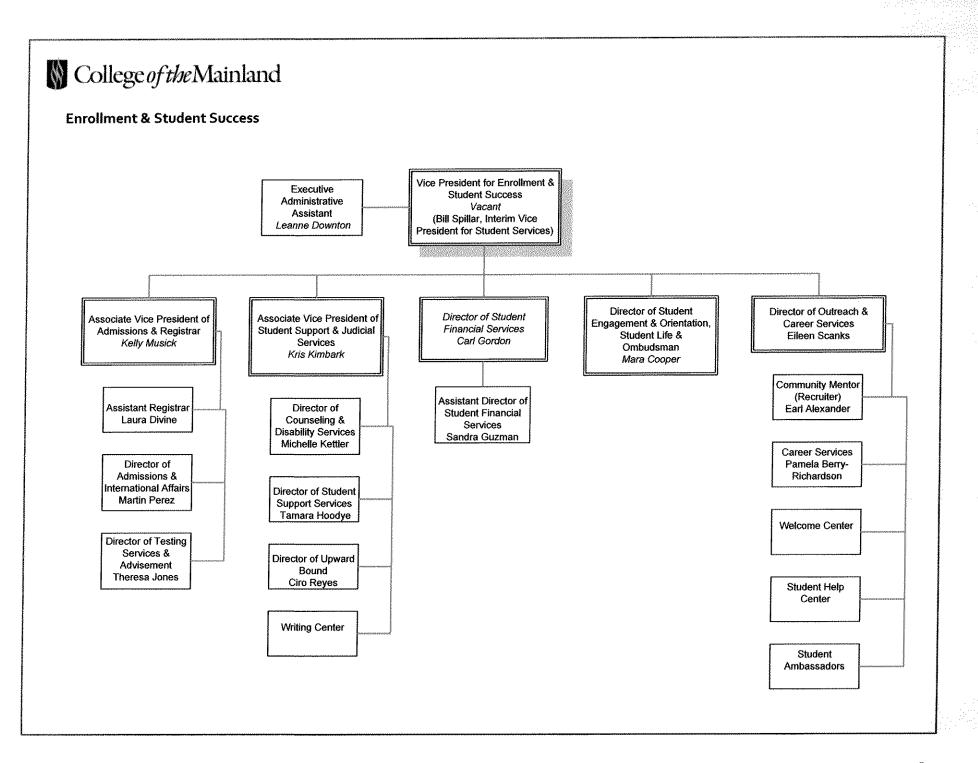
