Agency name: Howard College

The Howard County Junior College District was created by the voters of Howard County in 1945. The taxing authority of the district is Howard County. However, the service area encompasses thirteen counties covering 13,000 square miles in rural West Texas.

In addition, the Howard County Junior College District has administrative responsibility for the SouthWest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf (SWCID). Established by the Legislature in 1981 (Chapter 131, V.T.C.A., Education Code), SWCID is a post-secondary, self-contained institution with mainstreaming opportunities that provides educational and career training for the deaf and hard-of-hearing in Texas and the Southwest. It is the third self-contained post-secondary institution in the United States and the only community college for the deaf in the world.

The community colleges of Texas are unified in their stance against special and exceptional items with the exception of a limited number of initiatives. SWCID is one of the special items supported by the Texas Association of Community Colleges. From its inception, SWCID has received state appropriations for operation based on its unique mission. In recent sessions the Legislature has appropriated funds for physical plant upgrades and construction. The original buildings were structures that remained from the closure of Webb Air Force Base. As a result, this request contains operating funds for SWCID as a special item with exceptional items included to meet special needs above the base funding request. An exceptional item request is included to finish the HVAC controls upgrade that was started in 2008.

This report reflects financial and personnel data for Howard College. Data for the SouthWest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf is contained as the Supplemental Item and as the associated Exceptional Items. SWCID's supplemental schedules are included per instructions from the LBB. As the appropriation process proceeds, it will be important to remember this reporting methodology and to ensure that SWCID and SWCID's personnel are factored into the appropriation calculations for Howard College.

Howard College and SWCID endorses the additional formula request that was made on July 31, 2008 by the Texas Association of Community Colleges. As one of the small, rural community colleges, we are hard pressed to compete with institutions in larger urban markets in the provision of ever-changing technology, building construction and maintenance, and employee compensation and benefits. However, we provide our students with a quality learning experience. In recent years we have funded lost state revenue through the increase of local taxes, increases in student tuition and fees, and private grants and contracts. Without adequate funding community colleges face providing reduced services for rural areas, continued increases in tuition and fee burdens on students, and/or continued increases in the tax burdens on the few communities that support our community colleges. Although the tax base has improved in our area due to the upswing in the petroleum industry, the human and business migration to the urban areas continues to erode rural communities. Rural residents and businesses struggle to maintain their communities, much less advancing them. Due to the fact that SWCID does not receive local taxes and in-state students have tuition waivers, the state appropriation is critical to the existence of SWCID. Your consideration for reinstatement of these funds is requested.

In the early 1990's, a phased renovation project was initiated at SWCID. Much of that project has been completed. SWCID is very grateful to the State for its support. Howard College was recently reaccredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. In preparation for reaccreditation, Howard County Junior College District recently completed a facilities master planning process assisted by the firm of Freese and Nichols, Inc. Phase I of this 20-year plan for the SWCID campus indicates the need for numerous upgrades that we have already made remarkable progress in completing. Most notably among these is the new workforce training center lab that is currently under construction. Soon, students in the workforce training areas of automotive body repair, building trades, and welding will have a new facility to learn their trades. We believe this will help the deaf students become productive members of society helping to make these individuals tax payers instead of recipients of tax dollars.

In addition the planning process revealed the need to address the air handling system for the educational/administration building as well as the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning controls campus-wide on the SWCID campus. Thanks to the funding of the SWCID Air Handler replacement project, we were able to complete a portion of the HVAC controls upgrade at SWCID.

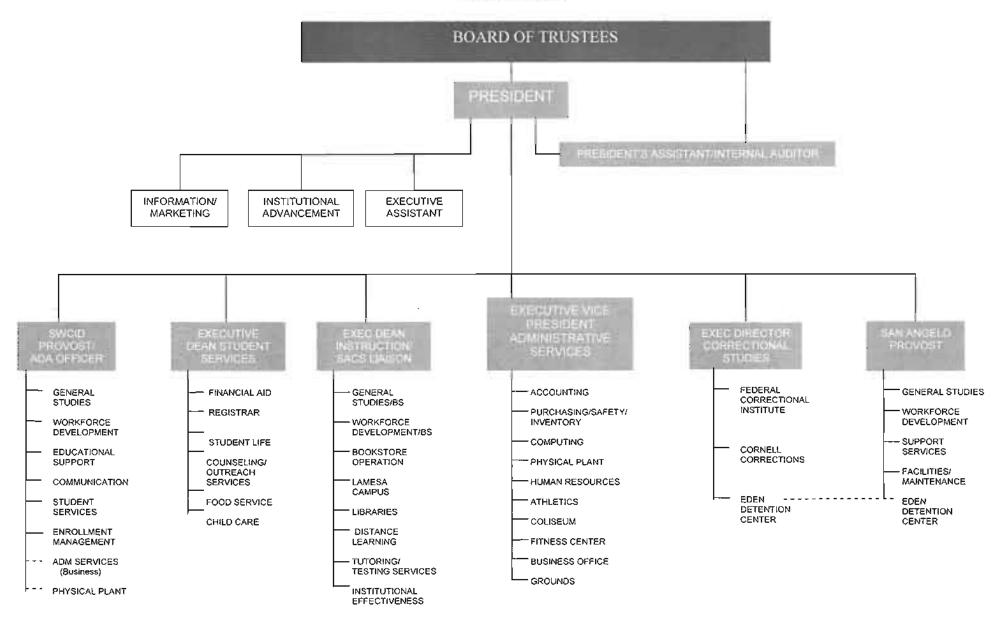

DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

SWCID began the HVAC controls system upgrade during the 2008 air handler replacement project. HVAC controls in some SWCID buildings are original and were installed as early as 1972. Many of these controls are out of date, inaccurate and are malfunctioning. If HVAC controls are inoperable or inaccurate it may result in energy inefficiency and poor learning conditions for students. An upgrade to current technology will ensure both efficiency and comfort in SWCID's buildings.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

SWCID does not have an alternative source of funds adequate to complete projects of this size. The buildings affected by this needed upgrade include the main classroom building, the Diagnostic Center, the student dormitory, the student union building and the activity center.

(2) Mission of Special Item:

The primary purpose of the SouthWest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf (SWCID) is to provide a comprehensive educational environment to assist deaf students in achieving their educational and career objectives. This two year college program for the deaf was established to provide course work and programs in developmental/preparatory studies, general studies, and vocational/technical training. Hearing individuals preparing for vocations in deafness-related fields may also pursue their educational career objectives at SWCID. Being a unique program, SWCID is equipped to provide a special population of students not only with educational course work and programs but also with necessary support services to accomplish their eductional goals.

(3) (a) Major Accomplishments to Date:

The SouthWest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf has served a postsecondary deaf and hard of hearing student population in Texas, across the United States, and throughout the world since 1980. SWCID has also served hearing students interested in pursuing programs that serve a deaf population including Interpreter Training and Paraprofessional for the Deaf Education. SWCID has provided instruction in various vocational fields, college transfer, and preparatory education.

SWCID has occupied existing facilities left when Webb Air Force Base closed, renovated them, and then used them to serve the needs of students attending SWCID. Within recent years, with the assistance of state funds, SWCID has replaced some of the older buildings with several new facilities designed to ADA specifications which now meet the educational needs of deaf and hard of hearing students. New facilities added include a new Residental Complex, Annex, and an Activity Center. A Vocational Building is currently under construction to provide lab and classroom facilities for Welding, Auto Tech and Building Trades. This building was funded in the last Legislative Session.

(3) (b) Major Accomplishments Expected During the Next 2 Years:

If funds are received as requested, SWCID will continue the phased renovation projects that were initiated in the early 1990's. The State's emphasis on the improvement of the SWCID facilities and infrastructure has resulted in increased enrollment from the deaf population. We anticipate a continuing trend of increasing interest in diverse educational programs. Deaf students educated at SWCID will become productive members of society instead of being supported by social programs.

(4) Funding Source Prior to Receiving Special Item Funding:

SWCID was not in existence prior to Legislative action.

If funding for the Southwest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf were reduced by 10%, it would negatively impact the operation of SWCID. Because Texas resident students at SWCID receive tuition waivers, and due to the fact that SWCID does not receive local tax revenue, SWCID has limited sources of revenue other than State funds. If funding were reduced by 10%, staff and programs would have to be reduced. This would
