Funds from students and local taxpayers now cover 55% of the College's total budget, while state formula funding represents only 26% of the total College budget for FY 2009. Currently 100% of our state appropriations are used to fund instructional salaries. However, there is not enough state money available to cover all faculty salaries and

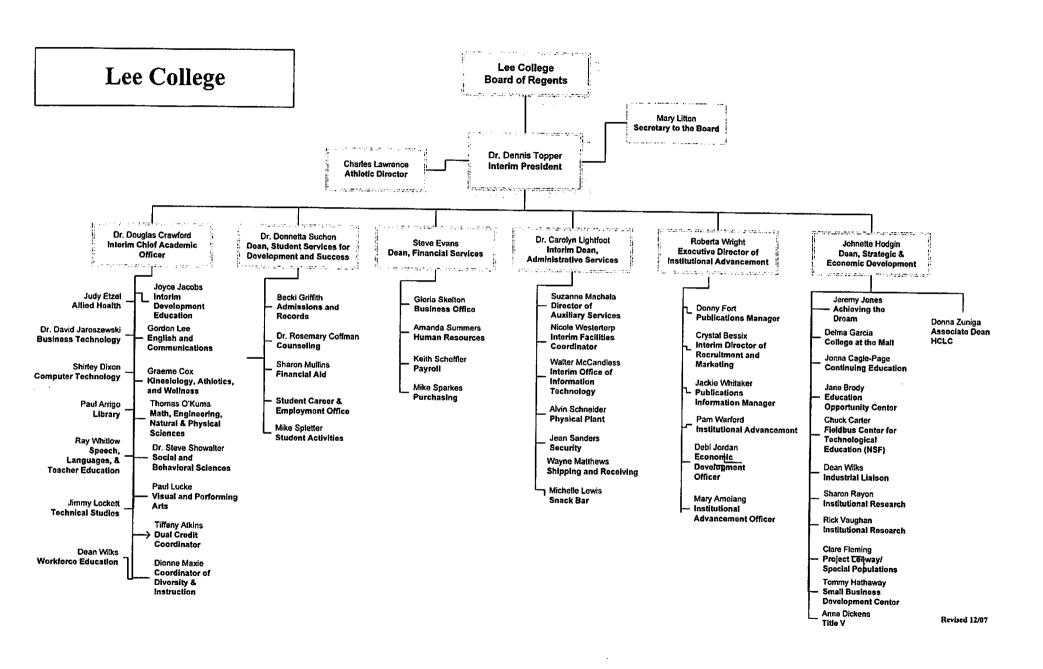
