



San Jacinto College is the seventh largest community college in the State. Throughout its history, San Jacinto College has demonstrated that it is a premier academic institution and is where people turn when they need to upgrade job skills, find training, advance their careers and begin or return to their college education. The cost to educate our students continues to increase as we compete for the best faculty, enhance technology, and focus on improving all aspects of quality in the classroom. Additionally, the level of student support required by our students is increasing as we continue to serve a changing population and a population that is not college prepared.

The following table illustrates the changing demographics of the San Jacinto College service area over the past 25 years:

The College's changing demographics are clearly illustrated by its certification as a Title V institution (Hispanic Serving).

More than 56% of the students attending the school districts within the SJC district are classified as economically disadvantaged; 30% of SJC students are classified as academically disadvantaged, and 50% are first generation college students. At one of the school district's served by San Jacinto College, the economically disadvantaged is actually estimated at 62.2%.

The educational attainment level of the population over 25 in the San Jacinto College taxing district (SJTD) is significantly less than the State of Texas and the United States. Persons with post-secondary education in SJTD are only 41.2% compared to 51.6% and 52.1% for the State of Texas and the USA, respectively. Even more concerning is the fact that 29.9% of the persons in the SJTD have less than a high school diploma compared to 23.8% for the State of Texas and 19.5% for the USA. These statistics clearly illustrate the challenges facing San Jacinto College in educating our constituents who ultimately will impact the economic future of the area and the State of Texas.

The three major revenue sources for San Jacinto College are state appropriations, local taxes and tuition & fees. The trend lines for these three sources reflect that state appropriations continue to decline while local taxes and tuition & fees continue to increase demonstrating that local taxpayers and students have been meeting their obligation to address the State funding shortfalls. Additionally, San Jacinto College is faced with significant concern regarding its tax base which is approximately 50% industrial. While the current valuations are strong due to rising prices of oil and oil products, the future forecasts indicate that the valuations for the petrochemical industry are projected to decline due to pollution exemptions, lack of expansion, declining inventories, and reduced production. Such reductions will force the already economically challenged students to fund more of their education and such an increase has the potential to push students away from education.

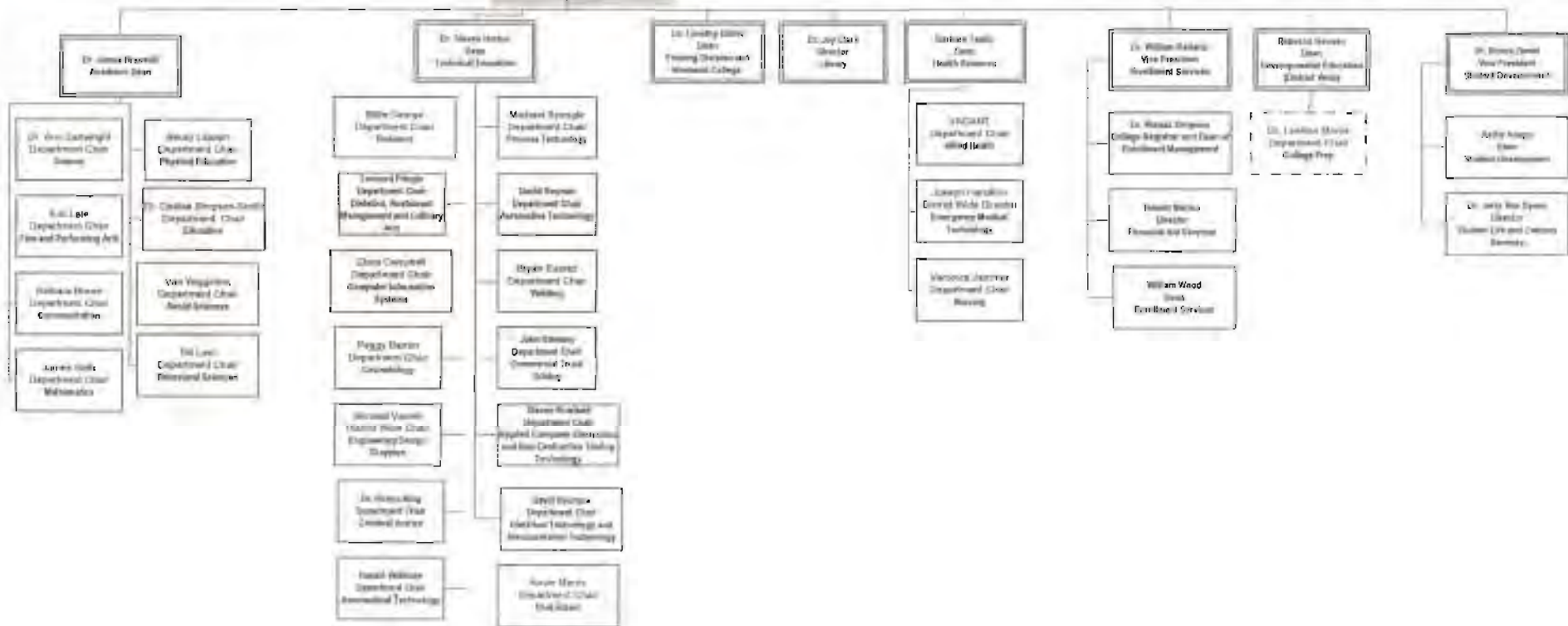
San Jacinto College respectfully requests that the State meet its share of the cost of higher education. Reduced funding levels are not acceptable and will not allow the college to reach the educational goals of the State nor are they adequate for Texas to maintain its national competitive advantage.

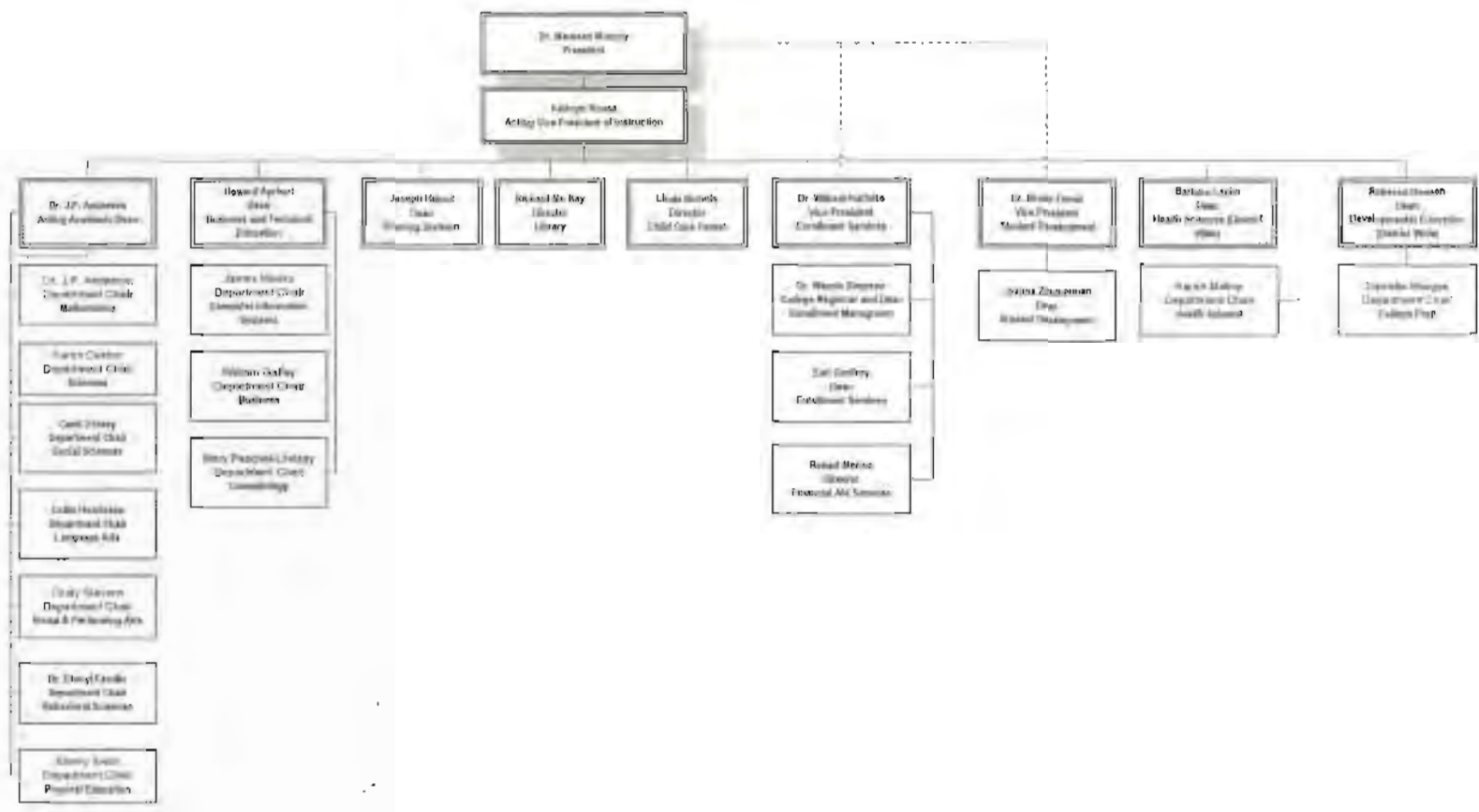
