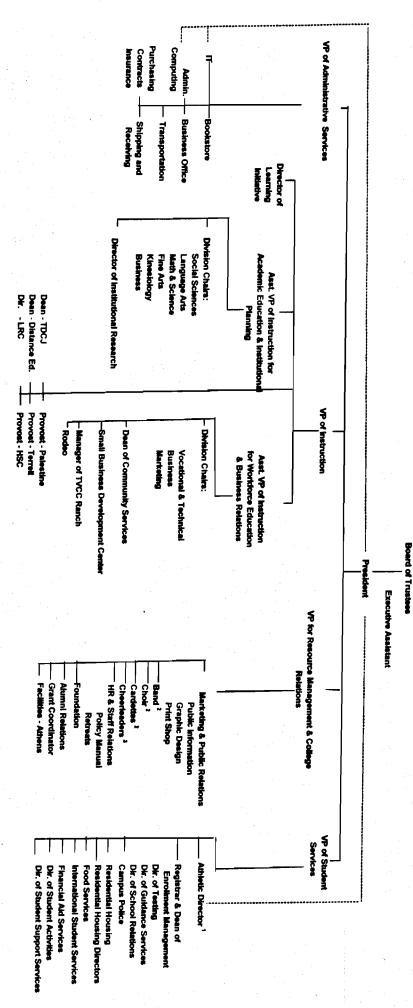

Since state-aid, the students will cause some of our students to discontinue their education at the post-secondary level. This is undesirable for both our local and state economies. Raising the ability to continue to survive without substantially raising the cost of education to our students and/or the cost of taxes to local property owners is in jeopardy. Raising the cost to local taxes, and tuition and fees are the fundamental, basic resources for Trinity Valley, there remains few, if any, alternatives. Trinity Valley continues to keep the cost of instruction as low as possible. Many institutions pay their personnel at much higher salaries than Trinity Valley.
