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#### **Administrator's Statement**

Clarendon College is a rural comprehensive community college committed to our students success. Our College provides academic transfer courses, career and technical educational programs, continuing education, personal enrichment and strives to serve as a cultural center for our communities. Clarendon College is very committed to the "open door" philosophy upon which community colleges were established.

Clarendon College was founded in 1898 in Clarendon, Texas (Donley County) and is the oldest institution of higher education in the Texas panhandle. Currently, the College serves eight counties in the panhandle: Armstrong, Briscoe, Childress, Collingsworth, Donley, Gray, Hall, and Wheeler. The College's service area constitutes more than 7,100 square miles with a population of more than 48,000 residents. Clarendon College is the only higher education institute within the service area and serves a critical role in the education and economic development of the area.

Clarendon College strongly agrees with TACC and its member institutions that to accomplish our mission of increasing student success, the state should continue with the new funding model implemented during the 83rd legislative session. The \$2.011 billion student success funding request for community/junior colleges should be appropriated through the three strategies in the General Appropriations Act:

- o Core college operations: \$50 million for the 2016-17 biennium. Clarendon College is a small rural college and this appropriation accounts for almost 11% of Clarendon College's revenue. With our tuition and tax rates considered some of the highest in the state, this amount is crucial to our continued success.
- o Contact hours: 90% of remaining funds. Clarendon College is working hard to increase enrollment at our four sites and meeting the changing educational needs of our constituents.
- o Student Success Points: the remaining 10% of funds; these success points should be funded at a rate that is no less than the rate funded for the previous biennium (\$185 per success point). Although Clarendon College stands to lose revenue with this model, we are committed to increasing these standards and recovering the funds. Clarendon College is committed to working alongside with our service area ISDs to meet the needs of their students in regards to HB 5. This has meant expanding Career and Technical Educational opportunities to the districts as well as working with their faculty to create curriculum to meet the college readiness standards established by HB 5.

Clarendon College is committed to working with TACC, our elected officials, and the Legislative Budget Board during the 84th Legislature.
