BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, upon the approval of the Board of Trustees that the Chancellor be authorized:

- To execute or authorize all contracts for Central Texas College District personnel services and benefits for which funds are appropriated and approved in the budget of the Central Texas College District for Fiscal Year ending 2014.
- Consulting and professional services contracts for which funds are appropriated and approved in the budget of the Central Texas College District for Fiscal Year ending 2014 will follow the rules established in Board Document 104, Section 8.27.
- To execute contracts for the acquisition of goods, materials, supplies, equipment and other items for which funds are appropriated and approved in the budget of the Central Texas College District for Fiscal Year ending 2014. In all cases, unless specifically authorized through established policies of the Board of Trustees, Central Texas College District Purchasing Policies and Procedures will be followed.

Chancellor FY2015 Budget Message

I am pleased to offer this budget for the Board of Trustees' review and approval consideration. The budget is balanced and in the black, but difficult decisions must be made in the upcoming year and in the years ahead.

We find ourselves challenged on all fronts. Revenues (local property taxes, student tuition, state appropriations and auxiliary funds) are either falling, or not increasing at the same rate as expenditures, most of which are required to providing relevant and high-quality instructional programs. The Administration continues to look for greater efficiencies as we transform student services and delivery of instruction. But an even harder recommendation from an examination of expenses unrelated to student services and instruction will be made by Administration in the coming year.

This year will continue to be one of even more reductions in military tuition assistance to military members, diminished value of DoD education contracts, larger expenditures imposed by external support and contracted agencies, higher internal costs to adequately compensate and provide benefits to our employees, deferred maintenance, and implementation of measures to assure quality and succeed in our mission while addressing increased complexity and compliance demands from accreditation, state, and federal agencies. In this budget, we absorb the costs of our ten-year reaffirmation of accreditation and associated quality enhancement plan.

As the Department of Defense continues to close installations and reduce force size, we find it more difficult to deliver education opportunities in the same manner that has made us so successful over past decades. Where we very recently filled classes with 18 to 22 students, we are now seeing enrollments of eight and fewer students. We are not alone. Other higher education institutions operating locations in multiple states and those serving military members are faced with similar challenges. Furthermore, the dictates of the Affordable Care Act will require our College to provide medical benefits amounting to an additional estimated \$700,000 in CY2015. To help offset costs associated with these mounting challenges, we are developing new services and delivery modes. We will also seek to negotiate a minimum of a 6 percent tuition increase at every US military site in the continental United States outside of our Texas tax district.

Here at home, our in-district tuition and property tax rates continue to be among the lowest in Texas. We intend to remain competitive and provide our in-district students with top-notch programs and services, however with declining military contract profitability we will need to move our rates closer to neighboring districts. Accordingly, the Administration has included a mid-year tuition increase of \$5 per credit hour in-district, and commensurate increases out-of-district. The Administration will also introduce differential tuition rates for high cost programs. Unlike the majority of other community colleges, our students will continue to pay no across-the-board fees.

While the cost of higher education is a concern, the Texas Success Initiative demands that we provide the student services and instructional programs to enable our students to gain entry to, and succeed in, our college. To this end, we have begun a number of transformative initiatives that need investment in this budget cycle. Major transformative initiatives include: development of a virtual one-stop student services center; purchase and implementation of MyCompass software to semi-automate military training evaluation services; continued digitization of faculty, staff and student records for indexing, retrieval, and archiving; implementation of an online admission application and related course registration; FAST—Faculty Advise, Students Thrive—a quality enhancement plan; and continued renovation of facilities, including approximately 20 classrooms with smart technology. To further reduce student costs and enhance student success, we are exploring expanded class schedule offerings (including more classes at night and on weekends), expanded online course offerings, and expanded adoption of electronic textbooks.

Enabling enhanced success for students depends largely on attracting, developing and retaining top quality staff, administration and faculty. A key part of this effort includes offering competitive salary and benefits. Accordingly, Administration has included a 1% cost of living salary adjustment along with the proficiency-based, one-step salary increase of 2.5% for those full-time, regular employees not subject to separate contract or labor law. For employees working under a DoD contract, we have included the mandated contract salary scale, which includes a 3% wage increase for full- and part-time employees.

Physical facilities are a key element for not only student success but also increased productivity for staff and faculty. As part of the Facility Condition Assessment accepted by the Board of Trustees in 2013, with this budget we continue to address deficiencies identified in that study. We have included funding for \$20M in capital projects and major repairs to provide for significant infrastructure replacement, remodeling and safety enhancements, as well as to commence design on projects that will be constructed in future budget years.

The challenges of transforming student services, enhancing instructional programs, overcoming military personnel and education benefit reductions, and complying with increased government regulation all serve to make this budget cycle pivotal to our future relevancy and success. I believe this budget, although challenging, will make Central Texas College a great place for students to learn, faculty to teach, and everyone to work.

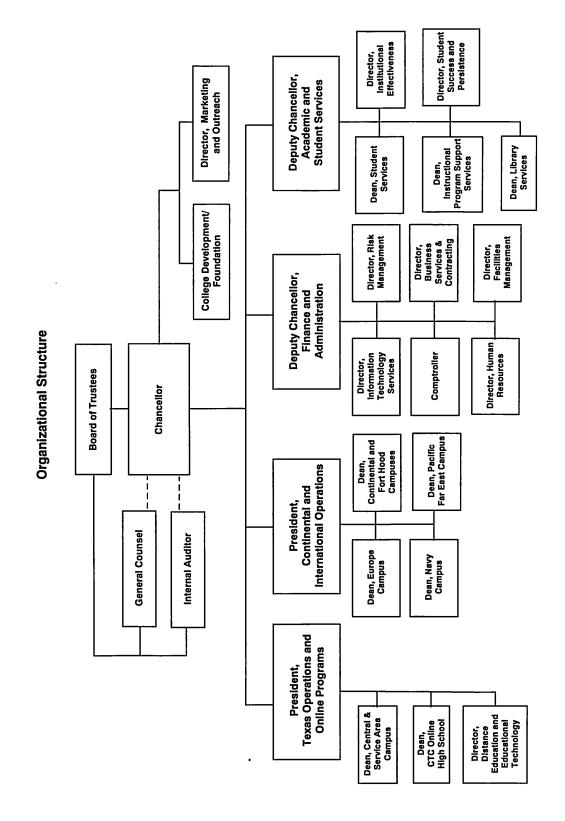
All revenue and expenditures included in the Consolidated Budget are displayed in one of the separate budgets listed above.

PERSONNEL

This budget provides for an average of 3.5% increase in salaries for fulltime faculty, non-exempt employees and exempt employees.

Tuition and Fee Schedule

TUITION AND FEES:

The State of Texas requires that each student sign an affidavit certifying his/her legal residence at the time of enrollment.

In order to be eligible for resident tuition rates, students must prove, to the satisfaction of the Admissions and Records Office, that he/she is entitled to be class ified as a resident of Texas.

The responsibility of registering under the proper resident classification is that of the student, and questions concerning his/her right to classification as a resident of Texas must be clarified prior to the time of enrollment.

All tuition and fees are subject to change as approved by the Board of Trustees. All tuition and fees must be paid at the time of enrollment unless on the Deferred Payment Plan. A student is not officially registered until tuition payment is made in full. Until all financial obligations to the College have been satisfied, a student cannot register, graduate, or have a transcript issued.

A student who drops a course after the start of classes but then adds one of an equal cost will be allowed to do so without penalty if the drop/add occurred prior to the census date. If the charges for the hours dropped under such circumstances are greater than for the hours added, the refund schedule will be applied only to the net charges dropped.

1. <u>TUITION - Semester Credit Courses</u>

- Legal resident of the state of Texas: (In-District) \$71.00 per semester credit hour. \$76.00 per semester credit hour effective January 1, 2015
- Legal resident of the state of Texas: (Out-of-District) \$93.00 per semester credit hour. \$98.00 per semester credit hour effective January 1, 2015
- Legal resident of another state or a non-resident alien or students with excess undergraduate credit hours: \$209.00 per semester credit hour. \$214.00 per semester credit hour effective January 1, 2015

2. <u>OTHER FEES:</u>

In addition to tuition, the following fees are required when applicable. Normally, fees are not refundable; however, a refund for overpayment of transcript/record fees will be made upon written application from the student. Exceptions require written approval of the Chancellor.

6. REFUNDS OF TUITION AND FEES

No tuition refunds will be made except in the case of cancellation or official withdrawal from Central Texas College or from a course. All refunds for tuition will be computed from the date the Application for Withdrawal or Refund is filed with the Records Office (not from the date of last attendance).

Students who officially withdraw from the Institution shall have their tuition and mandatory fees refunded according to the following schedule:

- A 100 percent refund is to be made for courses dropped prior to the first class day.

- Class day count begins with the first day of instruction (the first calendar day of the term) and includes all weekdays, Monday through Friday, which are not designated official Central Texas College holidays.
- Tuition and fees paid directly to the Institution by Veterans Administration, Title IV (Financial Aid Programs), a sponsor, donor, or scholarship shall be refunded to the source rather than directly to the student.
- Special consideration is available under the following conditions:
 - Any student suffering a catastrophic illness/accident or death in the immediate family, and,
 - Active duty military students who receive PCS or deployment orders and dependent family members of active duty military, who receive PCS orders after the start of classes which require the service member to depart before the class is completed.
- A student must present a copy of deployment orders, medical certification, obituary, or death certificate along with the refund request to be eligible for special consideration. Refunds under these conditions, prior to 01/01/2015, will follow the tuition refund schedule listed below:
 - If withdrawing prior to the 20th class day for semester-length courses (or prior to the last day for 25 percent refund for non-semester length courses), 100 percent refund;
 - If withdrawing between the 21st day for semester-length courses (or the day after the 25 percent refund period for non-semester-length courses) and the mid-point of the course, 50 percent refund;
 - After the midpoint of the course, no refund will be given.

Refunds under these conditions after 01/01/2015 will follow the tuition refund schedule listed below:

- If withdrawing prior to the 20th class day for semester-length courses (or prior to the last day for 25% refund for non-semester length courses), 100 percent refund;
- If withdrawing between the 21st day for semester-length courses (or the day after the 25% refund period for non-semester length courses) and the 60% point of the course, 50 percent refund;
- After the 60% point of the course, no refund will be given.

Please note that NTC rotations and field exercises are NOT considered deployments under this policy.

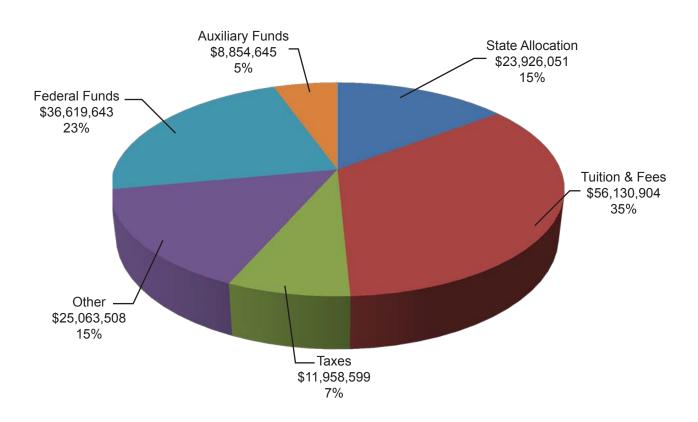

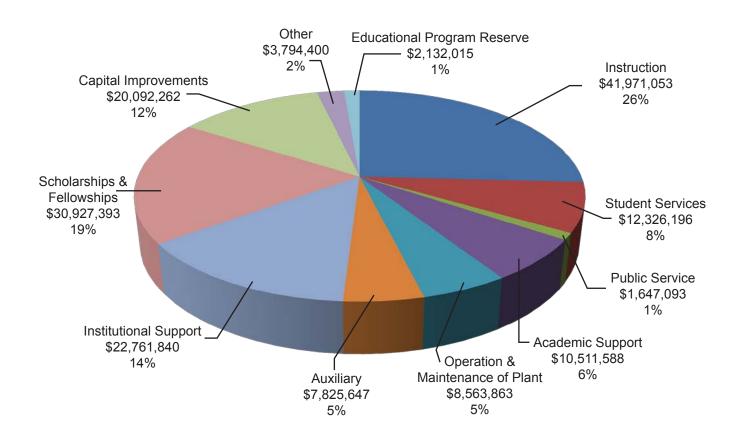
Consolidated 2014-2015 Budget Revenue Distribution by Source
