Western Texas College, operating under the Scurry County Junior College District, was created by the voters of Scurry County in 1969. Western Texas College's service area, which extends over a vast 9,000 square miles and encompasses 26 high schools, includes Scurry County, its taxing authority, and the following nine counties, Borden, Dickens, Fisher, Jones, Kent, Mitchell, Nolan, Runnels, and Stonewall.

All seven elected members of the Board of Trustees of the Scurry County Junior College District currently live in Snyder and serve six year terms on the board. The members of the board and their terms are as follows: Lee Presswood, 2012-2018; Eddie Peterson, 2012-2018; Scott Richburg, 2012-2018; Dr. Jay Kidd, 2016-2022; Tim Riggan, 2016-2022; Drew Bullard, 2014-2020; and Mike McWilliams, 2014-2020.

WTC's enrollment in all segments has experienced a slight increase the past two years primarily due to the decline of the oil and gas industry in Scurry County and surrounding areas. The preponderance of low skill, high wage jobs this sector offered drew many potential students to the classroom instead of the field. Every business sector in Scurry County is in need of skilled employees. With an area unemployment rate above 6%, WTC is drawing students returning to school to learn a new trade or begin a new career.

In 2012 WTC introduced two new occupational programs, Petroleum Technology and Wind Energy, to better sever the emerging industry demands. The start-up costs for these new programs were funded by a Federal Grant, and did not involve state or institutional funds. WTC has now absorbed the cost of the programs and is hopeful that future enrollment in the programs will cover their expenses. These new programs are beneficial to our rural west Texas oil and gas based industry.

Western Texas College is facing a significant decrease in annual local tax collections. The effective tax rate for 2016-2017 is significantly higher than the allowable state cap, which is causing WTC a decrease in tax revenue by over \$1.6 million. WTC has not raised in-district tuition for the past 4 years, in part, to help attract area students; yet state funding continues to be a major concern. Western Texas College joins our partner community colleges which have asked, through our statewide organization, the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC), for consideration of a \$1.83 billion formula funding request of the 85th Legislature. WTC endorses the \$1.83 billion request for the 2018-2019 biennium and recommends, as the July 28, 2016 letter from TACC outlines, that funding for community colleges be appropriated through three strategies: Core Operations, \$75 million, Student Success, \$186.6 million, and Instruction, \$1.567 billion.

The cost of instruction and operations continues to increase, making it a very difficult time for Western Texas College and rural west Texas. With additional support from the state of Texas, we will continue to expand the opportunity for rural students to avail themselves of a college education through partnerships with numerous independent school districts in our large service area by offering dual credit classes for high school students, and through our Early College partnership with Roscoe ISD. Western Texas College will also continue to focus on providing services to all students to help the state meet the goals set forth in the 60x30TX higher education strategic plan.
