Northeast Texas Community College supports the \$1.8 billion consolidated formula funding request by Texas Association of Community Colleges as set forth in the July 28, 2016 letter. With additional support from the state of Texas, Northeast Texas Community College will:

- Expand our award-winning CTE/Dual Credit center in Mt Pleasant which supports workforce programs vital to our local economy, in full partnership with 3 ISDs and local manufacturing employers. Our region needs a full robotics program. This partnership is a mature (6 years) project that closely resembles the "P-Tech High School" model currently advocated by the State and is delivering strong employment outcomes. Active industry partners include JBS, Priefert Mfg., Newlywed Foods, Lowes Distribution, Dekoron, and US Steel.
- Fully implement a Student Success Coach program in partnership with College Forward, a non-profit who has proven 30%+ improvement in the persistence and graduation of at-risk students. This would double the number of success coach/advisors to mentor students.
- Begin participation with the Texas Success Center project, "Guided Pathways", with particular focus on post-community college transfer issues. Creation of a NE Texas consortium of 3 community colleges is underway, but lacking sufficient funds to move quickly.
- Expand our first-in-the-nation work scholarship program, which provides students with meaningful work at above-market wages, and allows them to complete their community college degree w/o student loan debt. This program is uniquely designed to address the cost of attendance while also preparing "work-ready" students who will have a valuable work history to add to their educational credentials upon graduation. Primary funding for this program is provided by private donors; however, administrative costs are limiting the number of students we can serve.

Northeast Texas Community College's Campus is located approximately six miles southeast of Mt. Pleasant, Titus County, Texas. Classes are offered at alternate sites in Camp, Morris, Franklin, Red River, Titus, Upshur, and Wood Counties. The College provides associate, vocational, and continuing education courses.

ORGANIZATION OF COLLEGE

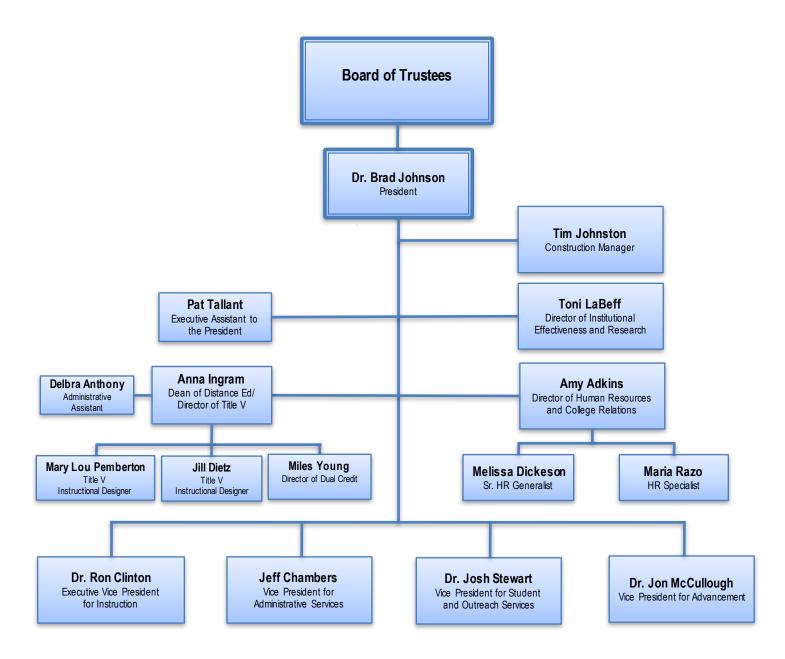
